Course Description:

Experience the culture of one of Europe's richest cultures and most historically significant cities, all while learning about local and regional sustainability issues. The experience will initially focus on Rome, including tours of major areas and landmarks such as the Colosseum, Vatican, and Forum. Students will engage with local sustainability stakeholders with expertise in urban community development, renewable energy, climate adaptation, climate mitigation, and/or other issues. After Rome, students will travel to Salerno and Calvanico, which are near the beautiful Amalfi Coast. There you will spend time immersed in a sustainable farm environment and learn sustainable farming/land use techniques, bake traditional-style bread and pizza, and engage in other sustainability-related activities.

The pre-departure content provides an overview of sustainability-related topics including economic, environmental, and social sustainability implications of food, energy, water, buildings, and natural resource use. Students engage in critical thinking about contemporary issues in sustainability, both domestic and international. The course will have some cultural and sustainability content specific to Italy in the pre-departure content as well. Optional excursions to local (Delaware) sustainability-focused locations will be provided prior to departure.



Study Abroad Travel Expense Includes:
